The EPA will be recognized for exemplary performance and results in the area of "Improved Financial Performance" and the NSF will be recognized for its exemplary performance and results in the area of "Expanded Electronic Government."

The Presidential Award for Management Excellence is the highest recognition given by the Federal Government to Federal agencies for management excellence. As the Director of the U.S. Office of Personnel Management, it is an honor and a privilege for me to manage this prestigious award program.

President George W. Bush's Management Agenda focuses on five management areas with the greatest potential for modernizing the government's work processes and workforce.
