Subject: 2020 Census; Employees May Perform Short-Term, Temporary Work

The U.S. Census Bureau has begun its campaign to recruit hundreds of thousands of individuals across the country to fill a variety of temporary jobs, including recruiting assistants, office staff, census takers, and supervisory staff. Because of these efforts, we are beginning to receive questions from current Federal employees about accepting employment for the 2020 Census. In response to these questions, we are providing the following general information on dual employment – receiving pay for more than one position:

- In accordance with 13 U.S.C. 23(b), the Census Bureau may hire Federal employees upon approval of agency directors, but only for temporary, short-term work on the 2020 Census.

- The statutory prohibition against receiving pay for more than one position found in 5 U.S.C. 5533(d) does not apply within the purview of 13 U.S.C. 23(b). Therefore, current Federal employees who are hired for the 2020 Census may receive pay for this short-term, temporary work.
- Federal employees wishing to work with the 2020 Census may visit <u>www.2020census.gov</u> to apply.

We ask that you make your employees aware of this information so that they may take advantage of these short-term employment opportunities.
