Employee Health and Fitness Month, May 2008

Each year in May employees all over the Nation celebrate Employee Health and Fitness Month, part of the National Physical Fitness and Sports Month. In his April 29th proclamation, President George W. Bush urges all Americans to participate in activities that help maintain a healthy lifestyle, and to encourage family, friends, and neighbors to live healthier lives by participating in physical fitness activities. The U.S. Office of Personnel Management (OPM) has embraced physical activity as one of the four pillars of the HealthierFeds Initiative (healthierfeds.gov), a campaign to encourage positive health decisions among Federal employees.

While many agencies have taken advantage of the opportunities provided by law to establish and operate employee health and fitness programs and facilities, OPM recognizes the positive impact agencies can make with special promotional efforts at the workplace.
